Happy as he had ordered it in the bar on his own. On the last day he even swam himself! :).

Normal conditions and good roads work miracles - everyone can feel like a fully-fledged person.

It is really funny to go shopping with Julia and Anichka. The only thing they do is collecting gifts :)

In the air there was always the atmosphere of true joy, laughter, jokes and friendship. "Oh let's paint Andrew." "It's not necessary, we've already surprised

everyone here ..." And indeed we surprised them all, in a good sense of cause. I am dreaming the time when kindness and joy will stop surprising people and become an ordinary thing to everyone.
